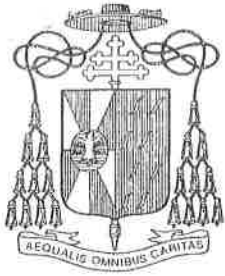

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I, Rev. Edmund H. Haen, with firm faith, believe and profess all and everything that is contained in the Symbol of Faith (the Creed), that is:

I believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen. 
PRECEPT

In response to the pastoral needs of this Christian community, in virtue of his authority as diocesan bishop (c. 381, §1), and in accord with the provisions of canon 49, on May 25, 1995 Archbishop Rembert G. Weakland formally placed upon Reverend Edmund Haen a precept for the purpose of restricting his exercise of ministry. The circumstances calling for these restrictions have now been reviewed and it has been determined that modifications in that precept can be made without endangering the good of the ecclesial community. Therefore, effective this date, the following modifications to the original precept are in effect:


- 1) The public celebration of Eucharist at Alexian Village is permitted provided the administration of the facility has no objections;
- 2) The faculty to hear confession is restored but may only be exercised when a penitent explicitly requests the individual celebration of the Sacrament of Penance.

The remaining restrictions continue and will remain in effect until notice of their revocation since they are seen as necessary and prudent precautions.

Dear Father Haen,

According to the obligations of the Code of Canon Law we are obliged to nominate a sufficient number of Pro-Synodal Judges for our Archdiocesan Tribunal. You have already served in this capacity and your past performance serves as recommendation for this present appointment.

Some time ago the Officialis wrote to you and mentioned that the terms were expiring and counted on your continued help as a Pro-Synodal Judge. Since that time we have synchronized the terms of all twelve Pro-Synodal Judges. With that in mind I have already written to the Diocesan Consultors and have obtained their canonical consultation.

With this letter I appoint you as Pro-Synodal Judge, with all the rights and duties given by the Code and subsequent Norms of Law. According to Canon Law this appointment is for a term of ten years and becomes effective on August 1, 1977.

May I ask you in the near future to take the necessary Oath of Office and Profession of Faith before Monsignor Gass as Vicar General or Father Klemme as Officialis.

Please accept my personal gratitude for the service you have already rendered and for your generosity and willingness to be of continued help in this apostolic work.

On Tuesday March 1, 2005 I received a call from a woman in Milwaukee who remembered my name from a Journal Sentinel article by Jim Stingl in [REDACTED] about abusive Priests. She was quite disturbed as she had just learned her thirty year old brother had been sexually abused by Father Ed Haen when he was a twelve year old altar boy at St. James in Mequon. [REDACTED]

Her call was very painful to me as it brought back the personal guilt I have about not going public about the heinous behavior of Ed Haen much earlier. And it angers me to think that the slow response to my 1989 letter about Haen to Archbishop Weakland may have contributed to this young man's abuse and the abuse of others. I received several calls shortly after Jim Stingl's article from men of all ages who had been abused by Haen; many had never shared their horror with another before...it was heart wrenching. How well I know and how well I know the life long effects the abused suffer.

I hope this note will deepen your conviction to persevere in your efforts to protect the children and young people under your care.

On Monday, March 5, 1990 I met with Ed regarding the allegations from [REDACTED]. With a great deal of anxiety, Ed acknowledged the substance of that letter and recounted the context of his relationship with the family at St. Lawrence Parish some 45 years ago. He stated that there was absolutely no relationships of any similar sort for many, many years. I said that in view of his current aggressive therapy for cancer and his impending retirement, I would not request any sort of evaluation at this time and would send a letter to [REDACTED] reporting the type of follow up activity I had taken. Ed was grateful for this expression of support at a difficult time and promised full cooperation. His health seems to have deteriorated as a result of the surgery and radiation treatments.

Dear Father Haen,

As you are aware I must frequently review the situation of priests who have had allegations of misconduct placed against them. You know of my comments at the Spring Assembly for Priests where I indicated that even retired priests may have to have some restrictions placed on the ministry they can offer. My concern is both to ensure that the integrity of the priesthood is upheld and to protect the diocese from any allegations of improper monitoring which might place persons at risk.

I have pondered how best to proceed with decisions regarding your status and exercise of ministry. I must bear in mind both my responsibility toward the good of the whole community and respect for your individual rights.

Given the serious nature of the obligations of celibacy, as well as the seriousness of violations alleged to have occurred by you, I find that some necessary and prudent precautions must be taken. This decision is ultimately a pastoral measure to protect the rights and reputations of all involved.

Therefore, I am enclosing a document which specifically details any ministerial restrictions which are to be observed by you. Please note that these restrictions apply to any ministry with the exception of Mass celebrated at Alexian Village.

I know that I can count on your cooperation and obedience in this matter.

Ed, This doesn't change much on present understanding but makes it a bit clearer.

PRECEPT

In response to the pastoral needs of this Christian community, in virtue of my authority as diocesan bishop (c. 381, §1), and in accord with the provisions of canon 49, I formally place upon Reverend Edmund Haen the following obligations:

- 1) To refrain from all contact with minors;
- 2) To cease until further notice all public ministry; allowed is the celebration of Eucharist in a private setting with another priest or priests in attendance or public Mass celebrated only at Alexian Village; the celebration of any other sacraments will require my explicit permission in each case;
- 3) To avoid all places and situations that, from past experience, have been occasions of serious temptation in the area of sexual morality;
- 4) Until further notice the faculty to hear confession is revoked.

The reasons motivating this decree are the allegations of sexual activities in violation of the obligation of clerical celibacy (c. 277, §1). These restrictions are seen as necessary and prudent precautions and will remain in effect until notice of their revocation.

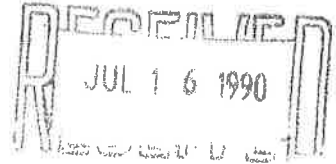

Archbishop Weakland shared a copy of your letter of July 6, 1992 to [REDACTED] and I hasten to respond in his name with an expression of dismay that, for some unknown reason, you were not contacted promptly with a further report on the matter you described. The Archbishop's original letter in the late Fall of 1989 certainly conveyed our sentiments and initial response.

My contact with Fr. Haen was delayed briefly by an initial absence from the Archdiocese on my part and by Fr. Haen's protracted illness during Advent of 1989 followed by his serious surgery and aggressive nuclear treatment for cancer. I spoke with him in the hospital briefly and when I shared your letter with him, he acknowledged responsibility for unacceptable behavior on his part. In repeated meetings we began to make plans for his resignation and retirement. Although I no longer have extensive notes in this case, my practice was always to take such allegations seriously, to insist on professional counseling as needed together with spiritual direction and at least supervision by knowledgeable persons if immediate removal was not dictated to assure the protection of others. I do recall my concern at that time for your proper address (given the fact that your letter was written from a motel) and my need for advice on how to proceed (given Fr. Haen's serious illness and imminent retirement at that same time). I have a note indicating that some report was to be sent to you on March 5, 1990, but I am not able to find a copy of that letter in any files. As you know, Fr. Haen resigned and retired that Summer, assuming residence in Alexian Village.

As Vicar for Clergy, I've always attempted to act promptly and prudently in these cases (which have fortunately been few in number, at least here in Milwaukee). On occasion as needed, I have simply turned the matter over to civil authorities for investigation. You had a right to receive a report on the actions taken at that time as well as a further inquiry about your needs. I do not know what could have happened to result in your not having received such a letter. If there is fault, it does not lay in the office of Archbishop Weakland, but rather in my office. I am surprised now to discover that I find only sketchy documentation for my actions at that time. Please accept my profound apologies for this lack of follow through on someone's

part. The fact that my mother had entered her terminal illness that year may be some explanation, but not an excuse. For whatever reason, the further response apparently did not reach you as my normal practice would have presumed.

I repeat the Archbishop's initial hope for your care and healing, not because of the potential publicity now, but because of the rightness of such a response then. I cannot take away the pain of the past, but I can offer this word of partial explanation and personal apology. Please let me (414-769-3486) or Fr. Thomas Venne, the present Vicar for Clergy (414-769-3490), know how we can help at this time. Your name continues to be spoken with respect in the Archdiocese and we certainly wish to do anything we can to be of assistance.

On Thursday, January 18, 1990 Ed underwent prostate surgery at St. Mary Hospital in Milwaukee. On Tuesday, January 23, 1990 I visited with Ed learning of the aggressive nuclear radiation treatment he will be undergoing during the next month. We discussed his golden jubilee celebration scheduled for May 20, 1990 at St. James in Mequon and his intention to clearly separate the jubilee celebration and any issue of retirement. He acknowledged that he would not be able to work for approximately two months at the parish and reported his eventual desire to move to Alexian Village. I took the opportunity to initiate a brief conversation regarding the allegation received before Christmas and we agreed to pursue the matter more fully upon his release from the hospital.

Another favorite spot of his, believe or not, was the Rectory where he would sneak me upstairs for the night. He had a lot of cuts. Where this type of abuse would happen, I thought this must be morally right, since he was a priest & representative of God.

To be honest with you, I had no knowledge at this point, of right & wrong in the situation I was in.

If my mother knew what was going on, she would have been devastated. She went to mass daily & was brought up in a very religious background. My uncle the late Mr. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] and the Archdiocese entered into mediation to achieve reconciliation and restoration, to help repair the harm to [REDACTED] to address issues of concern to [REDACTED] about prevention of sexual abuse of minors in the future and reformation of Church practices in this regard, and to otherwise resolve and settle all disputes between them.

Accordingly, the parties to this Agreement wish to resolve and satisfy all claims of any nature that [REDACTED] has against the Archdiocese, and all of the Archdiocese's employees, agents, officers, directors, affiliates, and assigns, including, without limitation, all members of the Roman Catholic clergy and all parishes, schools, and religious orders, and any person or entity affiliated with the Roman Catholic Church in the territory of the Archdiocese, arising from the sexual abuse of [REDACTED] by Haen without the necessity of further proceedings or expense of any nature, and all parties wish to generally release one another from all liability for any claims that may exist to the date of the signing of this Agreement, including, but not limited to, any claims for sexual abuse of [REDACTED] by Haen.

So, in consideration of the mutual promises made here, and other valuable consideration, receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties to this Agreement agree as follows:

5. The Archdiocese hereby releases and forever discharges [REDACTED] from all claims, demands, and causes of action of any nature that were in existence up to and including the date of the signing of this Agreement.

In return for the payments set out above, and for the mutual promises contained herein, [REDACTED] releases and forever discharges the Archdiocese, and all of the Archdiocese's employees, agents, officers, directors, affiliates, insurers and assigns, including, without limitation, all members of the Roman Catholic clergy, and all parishes and schools, including, without limitation, St. Frances Cabrini Congregation and any person or entity affiliated with the Archdiocese of Milwaukee from, and covenants not to sue them for, all claims, causes of action, charges, and demands, whether in tort, contract, or otherwise, of any nature that he may have had at any time up to and including the date of signing of this

Agreement, including, without limitation, any claim of any nature arising from the assault, injury, whether physical or mental, or any other activity by Haen.


6. The Archdiocese hereby releases and forever discharges [REDACTED] from all claims, demands, and causes of action of any nature that were in existence up to and including the date of the signing of this Agreement.

Select Haen Sexual Abuse Intake Reports

- 4/30/02 Sexual Abuse Intake Report- A man reports that he was abused by Haen in West Bend at Haen's house and in his car in 1959 when he was 13-14 years old.
- 6/3/02 Sexual Abuse Intake Report- A man reports that he was abused by Haen at St. Francis Cabrini when he was 13 years old. Haen fondled him and attempted to sodomize him.
- 1/6/03 Sexual Abuse Intake Report- A man reports that he was abused by Haen at St. Lawrence Church in 1941-42 when he was about 13 years old. Haen fondled him and put his mouth on the survivor's penis. Haen took the survivor out west for two weeks and to Chicago a number of times.
- 5/3/04 Sexual Abuse Intake Report- A man reports that he was abused by Haen at St. Francis Cabrini in the mid-1960's when he was about 8-10 years old. The abuse occurred for approximately two years when the survivor was approximately 8-10 years old. Haen slept in the survivor's bed, touched the survivor's genitals and forced the survivor to touch his genitals. Haen also forced the survivor to masturbate him.
- 3/12/09 Sexual Abuse Intake Report- A man reports that he was abused by Haen in 1949-51 at a lake cottage. The survivor was 13-15 at the time of the abuse. Haen touched the survivor while putting a pillow over his head.
